

Zone 5 Requirements and Split Guidelines 2022-2023

REGION ASSIGNMENTS:

- Zone 5 will be splitting into 12 regions with 6-10 teams originally assigned.

POST SEASON FORMAT:

- There will be no more than 12 riders per individual class and no more than 12 teams at Zone Finals.
- Regions will combine and hold bi-regionals for the 2022-2023 show year.
- Each bi-regional final is guaranteed 2 spots in individual classes and 2 spots in the team competition at Zone Finals.
- Assigned Bi-regions for 2022-2023 will be:
 - Regions 1 & 8
 - Regions 2 & 3
 - Regions 4 & 5
 - Regions 7 & 12
 - Regions 6 & 11
 - Regions 9 & 10

8301 Regional Finals must be considered a community effort. All teams and individual riders who qualify to compete are expected to participate in the organization and/or running of the Regional Final in some way; including but not limited to providing a facility, schooling riders, show staff, volunteers, and horses.

8401 Zone Finals must be considered a community effort. All teams and individual riders who qualify to compete are expected to participate in the organization or running of the Zone Final in some way; including but not limited to providing a facility, schooling riders, show staff, volunteers, and horses.

POST SEASON DATES:

- The bi-regional show must be held no less than ten (10) business days before the Zone 5 Finals horse show and will be finalized and published by October 1, 2022. Last date for bi-region finals shows is TBD.

 - Zone 5 Finals - TBD - Tentative with venue TBD
- In accordance with IEA Rule 8501.4, IEA reserves the right to make changes to the Regional, Zone or National Finals schedule and/or procedures of competition provided any changes to the standard format are approved by the IEA Executive Committee.

ZONE FUNDRAISING PROPOSAL:

- In order to cover the cost of bi-regional finals and reach our fundraising goal. It is suggested that each region create a fundraising plan to cover the cost of three classes (\$200/class - \$600 per region).
- All teams that qualify for zone finals are requested to purchase a program ad in the Zone Finals program or to sell one ad of an equivalent amount.

Regional Finals

- Each bi-region will be responsible for fundraising and supporting their own regional finals shows. All Bi-region final shows are expected to cover their own costs and break even financially - profits will be rolled into the Zone Finals budget. Approved fundraisers at regular or region shows may be basket raffles, VIP table sales, t-shirts and cash donations.

Zone Finals

- All funds generated from bi-region finals shows will go towards Zone Finals expenses and/or the Zone 5 scholarship fund.
- Class Sponsorships will be sold for Zone Finals.
