



Zone 9 Requirements and Split Guidelines 2023-2024

Section 1: Region Information

- Hunt Seat teams will be split into 2 regions with 5-9 middle and high school teams assigned to each region.

Section 2: Postseason Format

- There will be no more than 12 individual riders per individual class and no more than 12 teams at Zone Finals.
- Each region is guaranteed 4 spots in both individual and team competitions.
- The remaining spots will be allotted based on rider population in each region as of December 1st of each year.
- In accordance with IEA Rule 8501.4, IEA reserves the right to make changes to the Region, Zone or National Finals schedule and/or procedures of competition provided any changes to the standard format are approved by the IEA Executive Committee.

Section 3: Post Season Dates

- Region 1 Finals: February 10-11, Tenino, WA
- Region 2 Finals: TBD, Sherwood, OR
- Zone 9 Finals: March 9-10, Sherwood, OR

Section 4: Fundraising Information

Each region will be responsible for fundraising & support of their own regional finals. All Region Finals shows are expected to cover their own costs and break even financially - profits will be rolled into Zone Finals budget. Approved fundraisers at regular or region shows may be basket raffles, VIP table sales, t-shirts, fundraising clinic, and cash donations.

8301 Region Finals must be considered a community effort. All teams and individual riders who qualify to compete are expected to participate in the organization and/or running of the Region Final in some way; including but not limited to providing a facility, schooling riders, show staff, volunteers, and horses. If a team cannot bring the allotted number of suitable horses, they will be asked to financially compensate providers who can bring horses as well as assist in the care of the provided horses.

8401 Zone Finals must be considered a community effort. All teams and individual riders who qualify to compete are expected to participate in the organization or running of the Zone Final in some way; including but not limited to providing a facility, schooling riders, show staff, volunteers, and horses. If a team cannot bring the allotted number of suitable horses, they will be asked to financially compensate providers who can bring horses as well as assist in the care of the provided horses.
