Amelia	WTAMU	Squeeze legs and lift hands and ride with contact. Will speed up on the rail, if you hang on her face.	YES	NO	NO	YES
Angel	Rondeau Farms	Definitely prefers looser rein to avoid pulling or head shaking.	YES	YES	NO	YES
April	NCTC	Older reiner. Give clear cues. Supportive hand for speed changes. Use voice. Set-up lope to trot transition.	NO	YES	YES	YES

Brother	Mile High Equestrian	Leg support in the center on patterns. Can get strong in the run downs. Gather on ends. Very little hand in spins.	YES	NO	NO	YES
Caliber	Twisted R Equestrians	Has a spur stop. Set up for left lead. Prefers loose rein. Cluck through turns.	YES	NO	YES	YES
Cannoli	Rising J Ranch	Prefers light contact. Don't collect. Hand down and ask with seat and leg for lead departures. Can be lazy.	YES	YES	YES	YES
Carl	Texas Tech	Ex cow horse. Bouncy at jog. Upright way of going. Hum to slow and whoa to stop.	YES	NO	YES	YES
Chexy	Midway	Ride forward and tap foot to turn. Will frame but avoid over riding.	YES	NO	YES	NO
Chica	Mile High Equestrian	Unsettled in center - hold with hand and spurs. Don't push too hard in circles, won't comeback. Build slowly to stop. Support in corners!	YES	NO	NO	YES

Cookie	WTAMU	Straight forward. Give clear cues. Higher frame on contact. Responsive to pace changes.	YES	NO	NO	NO
Doc	Texas Tech	Retired ranch horse. Point and shoot. Rides better on a medium short rein. Whoa means stop.	YES	NO	YES	YES
Don Julio	Midway	Retired reiner. Ride in front of leg with soft contact. Ride forward for lead changes. .	YES	NO	NO	YES
Elsa	Midway	Support through leg and ride through seat. Light contact.	YES	NO	YES	YES
Este	Mile High Equestrian	Lacks ambition. Keep legs active to avoid break of gate. Keep reins even.	YES	NO	YES	YES

Maggie (NCTC)	NCTC	Horsemanship horse with leg support or reiner. Support quietly in center. Pick hand up for lead change.	YES	YES	YES	YES
Maggie (RJ)	Rising J Ranch	Ranch horse/low level reiner. Collects nicely if soft and connected. Inside rein for lead departure. Spurs permitted but not preferred.	NO	YES	YES	YES
McQueen	Mile High Equestrian	Finished reiner. Can be dull. Protect leads in circles. Step forward before left turn.	YES	NO	NO	YES
Monroe	Texas Tech	Experienced ranch horse. Set up for leads. Step forward for the turn around.	YES	NO	YES	YES
Murdoc	Lone Star Equestrians	Responsive to quiet support. Avoid over-riding. Sit and "whoa" for stops. Hum for downward transitions.	YES	NO	NO	NO
Narnia	NCTC	She is deaf. Use multiple cues. Use light rein support and lots of leg.	YES	YES	YES	YES
Nic	WTAMU	Finished reiner and cow horse so he has quite a lot of feel. Protect leads through the center	YES	NO	NO	YES
Olaf	Mile High Equestrian	Bouncy trot. Good transitions. Soft lope. Be ready with feet to prevent an unsolicited backup.	YES	YES	YES	YES
Pal	WTAMU	Finished reiner. Accurate communication is key. Keep him framed for lead changes, especially right to left.	YES	NO	NO	YES
Peaches	WTAMU	Big mare. Smooth ride. Be patient executing transitions. Likes supportive leg and soft aids. Set up for both leads.	YES	NO	NO	NO
Pig	WTAMU	Finished reiner. Stay quiet into and leaving the middle. Honest once moving. Stay forward in spins. Good with leads/changes.	YES	NO	NO	YES
Pip	NCTC	Set up for leads, especially left. Light contact and supportive leg.	YES	YES	YES	YES
Rocky	Twisted R Equestrians	Likes soft consistent support. Hold in frame. Use your voice.	YES	YES	YES	YES
Sakoda	Girl Scouts of San Jacinto	Prefers vocal cues. Whoa means stop. Prefers not to be crowded.	YES	YES	YES	YES
Sally	NCTC	Make sure to keep her attention on you and be soft with her face.	NO	YES	YES	YES
Shirley (LS)	Lone Star Equestrians	Use standard cues. Prefers soft hand and leg support.	YES	NO	YES	YES
Shirley (SN)	Silent Knight Stables	Well broke. Support with leg.	YES	NO	NO	NO
Sissy	Rising J Ranch	Retired reined cowhorse. Forward. Responsive to seat. Ask and release. Straightforward with consistent cues.	YES	YES	YES	YES
Skai fall	Libby Hanon	Broke all around quarter horse. Rides best with leg pressure. Left dominant. Ride more forward to the right. More leg to keep collected.	YES	YES	YES	YES
Slim	Lone Star Equestrians	Use standard cues. Prefers soft hand and leg support.	NO	YES	YES	YES
Smarty	Lone Star Equestrians	Broke and straightforward. Responsive to correct cues. Hand forward to extend, hand back for collection.	YES	NO	NO	YES
Sparky	NCTC	Reiner that shows all classes. Can be lazy without consistent leg support. Prefers loose rein to avoid head shaking.	YES	YES	YES	YES
Thunder	Midway	Can be lazy. Keep straight and ride in front of leg. Will not turn fast, but will be smooth with patience and outside tapping foot.	YES	YES	NO	YES
Tucker	Texas Tech	Bouncy at jog. Cluck to trot. Whoa means stop. Support with legs for better maneuvers.	YES	NO	YES	YES
Uno	WTAMU	All-around horse. Likes a supportive leg. Adjustable through rein length.	YES	NO	NO	YES
